The transition has involved significant change in the Company's policies & process for Financial reporting, including generation of supportable Information & applying estimates to inter alia determine impact of IND AS on accounting & disclosure requirements prescribed under extant RBI Directions.

In view of the complexity involved, IND AS transition & the date of preparation of financial statements subsequent to the transition date have been areas of key focus in our audit.

Read the IND AS impact assessment performed by the Management & the resultant changes made to the accounting policies considering the requirements of the new framework.

Evaluated the exemptions & exception allowed by IND AS & applied by the management in applying the first time adoption principles of IND AS 101 in respect of Fair value of Assets & Liabilities existing as at transition date.

Tested the accounting adjustments posted as at the transition date & in respect of the previous year to convert the financial information reported under erstwhile Indian GAAP to IND AS.

Tested the disclosure prescribed under IND As.

1.Transition to IND AS accounting framework

The Company has adopted IND AS from 01 april 2019 w.e.f date 01 April 2018 for such transition. For periods upto & including the year ended 31 March 2019 the company had prepared its financial statements accordance with erstwhile generally accepted accounting principles in India (Indian GAAP). To give effect of the transition to IND AS, these financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2020, together with the comparative financial information for the period ended 31 March 2019 & transition date balance sheet as at 01 April 2018 have been reported under IND AS. The transition has involved significant change in Company's policies & process for Financial reporting, including generation of supportable information & applying estimates to inter alia determine impact of IND AS on accounting policies & disclosure requirements prescribed under extant RBI Directions.

In view of the Complexity involved & the date of preparation of financial statements subsequent to the transition date have been

Read the IND AS impact assessment performed by the Management & the resultant changes made to the accounting policies considering the requirements of the new framework.

Evaluated the exemptions & exception allowed by IND AS & applied by the management in applying the first time adoption principles of IND AS 101 in respect of the Fair value of Assets & Liabilities existing as at transition date.

Tested the accounting adjustments posted as at the transition date in respect of the previous year to convert the financial information reported under erstwhile Indian GAAP to IND AS.

2. Assessment of Investment in associates

This is considered as Key Audit Matter, since alternate audit procedures were performed for carrying out audit Due to Work from Home approach adopted, we performed following alternative audit procedures:

Various data and confirmation were received either electronically through email or through sharing on drive

For various audit procedure, reliance was placed on scanned copies of original document shared with us electronically

Interview/ discussion with client via call conferencing/ video conferencing and other verbal communication

Information other than the financial statements and auditors' report thereon

The Holding Company's board of directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report, Business Responsibility Report but does not include the Consolidated IND AS financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express



any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the Consolidated financial statements or our knowledge obtained during the course of our audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information; we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Management's responsibility for the financial statements

- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances. Under section 143(3)(i) of the Companies Act, 2013, we are also responsible for expressing our opinion on whether the company has adequate internal financial controls system in place and the operating effectiveness of such controls
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates and related disclosures made by management.

We are responsible for the direction, supervision & performance of the audit of the financial statements of such entities include in the Consolidated financial statements of which we are the independent auditors.
